Top 5 Reasons to Come to Everett

- 1. Friday's train ride behind NP 924 at the Northwest Railway Museum in Snoqualmie, which includes a full behind-the-scenes tour of NWRM's facilities

- 3. The first NPRHA convention north of Tacoma, so there is a focus on north Puget Sound topics and sites
- 4. Delta Marriott hotel is a very nice property and convenient to attractions in downtown Everett and the recentlyredeveloped Everett waterfront on Puget Sound
- 5. Involvement of Everett historians in the program, to help provide local flavor.

Short Walks

In conjunction with the Everett History Museum, we will have a couple of short walks near the hotel. One of the walks will be to the former NP depot and yard site, of which there is unfortunately nothing remaining. The other walk will be around downtown Everett, which several historic or otherwise interesting buildings, including a former Carnegie Library and a transportation hub for local and regional trains and buses.

- NP modeling presentations






Neighborhood Shops & Eateries

Transportation

Amtrak's Chicago-Seattle Empire Builder serves Everett Station in both directions daily. Amtrak offers one morning and one afternoon Seattle-Everett Station and Everett Station-Seattle train daily.

Sound Transit offers two Seattle-Everett Station morning Sounder trains and two Everett Station-Seattle afternoon trains daily. Sound Transit bus routes 510 and 512 link Seattle and Everett Station in conjunction with frequent Link Light Rail 1-Line trains between downtown Seattle and Northgate transit center. Route 510 offers afternoon-only through bus service downtown Seattle-Everett Station, morning-only Everett-Seattle. Check website for schedules.

Everett Transit routes 4 and 18 serve Everett Station and stops on Pacific Avenue near the hotel, with connections at Everett Station to downtown.

As of January 2024, the hotel does not furnish shuttle service.
